Resolution adopting the Master Fee Schedule for Fiscal

SUBJECT: Year 2016-17

CEQA: This does not constitute a "project" under the California

Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guideline Section 15378.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve a resolution adopting the master fee schedule for Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-17, including the annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustment and other changes as directed by Council.

DISCUSSION

Chapter 6.02 of the Pacific Grove Municipal Code (PGMC) requires a schedule of fees to be reviewed annually in conjunction with the budget process and established by City Council resolution. Notice of the public hearing was published in accordance with PGMC Chapter 6.02 and relevant California Government Code sections.

In accordance with the process adopted by Council for FY 2012-13, the current fee schedule has been adjusted, where applicable, by the 3.2% increase in the Cost Price Index (CPI) for the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose area for the period ending December 31, 2015. The CPI adjustment applies to all fees not controlled by other entities (e.g. State of California) or fees that are market driven (cemetery site sales, facility rentals, etc.). In addition to the CPI adjustment, staff has proposed changes to fees based on the City's cost recovery policy (Council Policy No. 400-4) and Council's direction to recover 100% of the costs associated with providing services to the public (with certain specific exceptions).

The attached Master Fee Schedule is structured to provide the current fiscal year fees and the proposed fees for FY2016-17. Changes other than those that resulted from the application of the CPI and the Sewer Rate Study are highlighted on the schedule.

FISCAL IMPACT

Staff anticipates the recommended fee additions and changes more closely correspond to the costs of providing services for FY 2016-17. The Interim City Manager has recommended that the City commission a fee study to ensure that 100% cost recovery is being achieved. In the event the study recommends alterations to the Master Fee Schedule, Staff will return to the Council for authorization to make any necessary modifications in Fiscal Year 2016-17.

HOLIDAYS

Rental facilities will not be available on the following days: New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, President's Day, Easter Sunday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day and the day following, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

RESERVATIONS

No verbal reservations will be accepted. Facility is not reserved until all fees have been paid and a contract has been executed. Class III reservations will be made on a first-come, first-served basis at a maximum of six months and a minimum of 10 working days prior to use. Cancellations result in loss of deposit and insurance fees. No refunds if cancelled within 10 business days of event. Park fees allow for a two-hour time block; deposit refund to be made within thirty days following event if City determines no damage resulted from usage.

RENTAL POLICIES

- 1. The City may require appropriate deposits or extra payments for special charges incurred.
- 2. The Charge for Class 1A is intended to help cover City costs for building maintenance and utilities related to the activity. All use under Class 1 and 1A shall be scheduled at a time convenient to the City in order to minimize expenses. Any Class 1A group requesting to use the facilities at a time when on-duty staff is not available will be charged a rental fee of \$13.00 per hour to cover staffing and other costs. Groups in Class 1 and 1A are expected to clean facilities after use. A minimum clean-up fee of \$30.00 will be charged if facilities are not cleaned to City's satisfaction.
- 3. All renters of City facilities shall complete a rental application and have it on file with the Recreation Department. City facilities may not be sublet without the express authorization of City.
- 4. All senior citizen nutrition programs serving Pacific Grove residents are exempt from rental fees and charges.
- 5. To the fullest extent permitted by law, all renters shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, its elected officials, officers, agents, and employees, both severally and collectively from and against any and all claims, liabilities, and losses whatsoever (including damages to property and injuries to or death of persons, court costs, and reasonable attorneys' fees), howsoever the same may be caused, except in cases of City's sole negligence, resulting directly or indirectly from or arising out the negligence or willful misconduct of the renter, its employees, agents, subcontractors, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable with respect to the performance of this Agreement and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the same shall include: (1) bodily injury, (2) death to any person or persons or, (3) injury to or destruction of tangible and/or property including that of the City, whether direct or consequential including the loss of use resulting therefrom. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnity, which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described herein. The City, at its sole option, may choose to provide all or a portion of the defense of claims, damages, losses, liability, costs, and expenses as set forth above, and in such event, the renter shall indemnify and hold harmless the City from the costs and expenses, including attorney's fees, of such defense."
- 6. Official Pacific Grove youth groups, under 18 years of age, will be allowed to use City facilities as Class I (no charge), scheduled at a time when a supervisor is on duty, with the approval of the City Manager, for activities on a space available basis. Examples of qualified users would be the PONY Baseball League, Pop Warner league, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts and Brownies.
- 7. The City will provide liquor liability insurance to cover events held in City facilities at which alcoholic beverages are consumed. Individuals and organizations responsible for such events shall pay a prorated share of the cost for such insurance, as may be determined from time to time by the City insurance carrier.
- 8. If the person or organization imposes a cover charge, sells alcoholic beverages, or otherwise comes under the jurisdiction of the State Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control, the City must be provided with evidence of a valid license from the State Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control.
- 9. Upon presentation of receipts or other proof of having used The Beach House Restaurant or the Point Pinos Grill as part of an event that includes the rental of a City Facility, the group or individual who rented the facility shall be reimbursed twenty percent (20%) of the facility rental fee paid.

- 2. After receiving a report of the proposed changes in fees, charges, and costs contained in the City of Pacific Grove FY 2016-17 Master Fee Schedule, and having held a public hearing on the changes, the City Council hereby authorizes the changes including any changes as directed by Council.
- 3. Per Government Code 66017, approved changes that relate to community development services shall be effective 60 days following final action by the City Council on the resolution. In the case of reductions, the reductions can be implemented on July 1, 2016, on a case-by-case basis, by decision of the City Manager.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of the policy is to guide the City Council's establishment of fees for service, fines, and other charges for service, in order to help ensure consistency in fee setting rationale. The policy is intended to provide broad guidance for service areas, without providing detailed guidance for all fee categories

It is the City Council's intent that the policy may be amended over time to address additional services area and evolving economic circumstances.

II. POLICY OF THE CITY

The City establishes fees according to Pacific Grove Municipal Code Chapter 6.02. Pursuant to Article XIIIB of the California Constitution, it is the intent of the City Council to recover a portion or all costs reasonably borne for providing government services to the extent such cost recovery reflects the appropriate balance of general revenue support and fees paid by the individual(s) benefiting from the service.

For enterprise services, in which the City is offering products or services for which the customer has broad market choices—facilities rental, cemetery land sales, or golf, for example—the City may choose to set rates based on current market conditions, with the goal of optimizing revenue for the City, beyond the cost of providing the service, and where rates accurately reflect the value received by the customer.

In setting fees, City staff shall prepare fees for City Council consideration, based on the following percentages of cost recovery:
