E. Philip Morgan specializes in public organizations and institutional development. While a professor of politics, public administration and development throughout his career, he has also worked, *inter alia*, with the World Bank, USAID and UNDP on diagnostic studies, technical assistance and training in organization and management improvement; human resource development; program evaluation; and trade capacity-building.

Morgan has published widely in the areas of program and project management, comparative civil service systems and reforms, and the linkages between development policy making and the instruments of policy action. He also serves on the editorial advisory boards of several journals and publishing firms specializing in international development policy and management.

He has lived and worked extensively in both the French- and English-speaking countries of Sub-Saharan Africa, with a long- term commitment to the countries of Southern Africa. He was a Fulbright Professor at the University of Botswana beginning a ten-year affiliation with the Institute of Development Management [1970s-80s]. In the 1990s he coordinated a research program for World Bank on "indigenous institutions and management practices in Africa". More recently he has:

- assisted with World Bank program reviews on HIV/AIDS in Africa
- Consulted with the European Union Studies Institute (IUEE), Autonoma
 University, Barcelona, Spain, on the development and delivery of an MA
 program in Development Cooperation, March, 2006. Subsequently he gave a
 practicum on "professional practice in development cooperation" in June
 2007, November 2007 and April, 2009
- Co-delivered country and topic briefings onboard the USS Nashville as part of the Naval Postgraduate School's Regional Security Education Program. The ship was bound for six West African ports on a capacity building mission in Maritime Safety and Security, January, 2009
- Co-delivered a seminar on "The Media and Civil-Military Relations" for 20 military officers and 20 journalists in Conakry, Republic of Guinea, for the Center for Civil Military Relations, Naval Postgraduate School, August 2008
- In 2006 Morgan was recognized with the Fred W. Riggs Award for Lifetime Contribution to International and Comparative Administration by the International Section of the American Society for Public Administration

Morgan earned his doctorate at Syracuse University's Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs. After many years as a professor and administrator at the School of Public and Environmental Affairs of Indiana University, Bloomington, he became Dean of the Graduate School of International Policy Studies at the Monterey Institute of International Studies, California in 1997. In 2003 he returned to teaching, research and consulting.
