



PACIFIC GROVE WEEKLY SUMMARY

December 18, 2015

CITY COUNCIL

Major actions taken by the Council at its regular meeting on Month #, 2015 include:

- ❖ City Manager Thomas Frutchey presented Jeffrey Haas and Michael Groshong with 10-year Service Awards and thanked them for their service to the City.
- ❖ Approved a resolution necessary to secure low-interest financing for the Pacific Grove Local Water Project.
- ❖ Held second reading and adopted an ordinance to amend the classification schedule for the Human Resources Manager position.
- ❖ Accepted an integrated package of recommendations for the regulation and management of short-term vacation rentals and directed staff to prepare implementing ordinances for review by the Planning Commission in January 2016 and approval by the Council as soon thereafter as feasible.
- ❖ Directed the City Manager to finalize and execute an agreement with Steven Belcher as Interim Police Chief.
- ❖ Interviewed three first having proposed to assist the Council in its selection of Pacific Grove's next City Manager and selected Ralph Andersen & Associates to conduct the recruitment and directed the City Manager to execute a contract.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Emergency Landing. On December 8, 2015, at approximately 8:00 p.m., Monterey Fire Personnel responded to an emergency landing of an Air Force aerial refueling tanker/cargo aircraft (KC-10) at the Monterey Regional Airport.

The aircraft originated from Travis Air Force Base, near Fairfield, with five crew members aboard and the planned destination was classified.

The crew discovered smoke coming from the aircraft and followed emergency protocol by landing at the nearest airport that was able to handle that size plane.

Monterey Fire Personnel from several units were deployed immediately due, in part, to the amount of fuel on board. Once the plane was safely on the ground, firefighters inspected the aircraft and found no sign of fire. It was later determined the smoke may have been generated from a faulty air conditioning unit and it was taken to the airport's jet center to be worked on. The aircraft pilot and crew handled the situation extremely well in a calm and cool manner.



Surf Rescue. On December 11, 2015, at approximately 10:06 a.m., Monterey Fire personnel, along with State Parks Life Guards, US Coast Guard and Pacific Grove Police, responded to a water rescue on Ocean View Boulevard near Lover's Point.

A male swimmer was caught in high surf approximately 100 yards off Lover's Point Beach attempting to swim to shore in rough conditions. Contact was made with the girlfriend of the swimmer on the recreation trail who advised that they both went out for a swim and she was able to make it back to shore. The swimmer was taken by the current to the rocky shoreline east of the beach. Fire personnel positioned a 35 foot ladder off the recreation trail down to the rocks. After multiple attempts the swimmer was able to get to the ladder and climb up to the trail. The swimmer had abrasions on his legs and was evaluated by American Medical Response (AMR)

CPR Incident. On December 12, 2015, at approximately 7:38 a.m., Monterey Fire personnel responded to Veteran's Memorial Park for a reported 32 year old male in full cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, CPR was being administered by off duty surgical nurses from out of the area. Fire personnel took over and found it necessary to use the Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) device to shock the patient's heart back into rhythm followed by chest compressions and bag valve ventilations. A second shock was delivered while American Medical Response (AMR) personnel arrived on scene and began administering advanced life support. A return of spontaneous circulation was noted when the AED was removed. The patient was then transported by AMR to the Community Hospital of the Monterey Peninsula (CHOMP). The fast action and skill of the nurses as well as Fire Department and AMR personnel helped to save the young cyclist who had been camping at the park.


MUSEUM


