FIRE DEPARTMENT

Wildland Fire Deployment (Wragg). One Monterey Fire *Line Emergency Medical Technician* (LEMT) continues to be deployed to provide medical aid to firefighters at the *Wragg Wildfire* located off Highway 128 approximately four miles west of Winters, California. The care provided by the LEMT often occurs in a harsh environment and the LEMT is often required to hike significant distances while carrying heavy packs and may also coordinate transportation out of the area for injured firefighters.

The fire is continuing to burn areas in Napa, Solano and Yolo Counties. Mandatory evacuations remain in effect for Mix Canyon, Sky Ranch Road, Wild Horse Canyon Road and Blue Ridge Road. Over 7,500 acres have been burned and the fire is currently at 80% containment. Firefighters are fighting the rapidly traveling blaze in 100 degree weather.



Wildland Fire Deployment (Lowell). On July 27, 2015, four of the Monterey Fire personnel who had been at the *Wragg Wildfire* were deployed from that fire to combat the Lowell Fire located in Nevada and Placer Counties. The fire started in the late afternoon of July 27 off Highway 80, west of Alta.

Evacuation advisories are in effect for various communities as well as numerous road closures in both counties. The public is asked to stay vigilant to any changes of evacuation areas. The Tahoe National Forest is maintaining a forest closure with specified exemptions for the fire area. As of Thursday morning, approximately 54 structures are threatened and the fast-moving wildfire has sent four firefighters to the hospital with burns. There are approximately 1,952 fire personnel battling the blaze which has burned over 2,303 acres and is at 60% containment. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.


