



PACIFIC GROVE WEEKLY SUMMARY

September 4, 2015

CITY COUNCIL

Major actions taken by the Council at its regular meeting on September 2, 2015 include:

- ❖ City Manager Tom Frutche presented employees Doe King and Brian Gorman with service awards and thanked them for their extraordinary service to the community.
- ❖ Mayor Kampe proclaimed September as National Recovery Month.
- ❖ Received a short presentation from Ron Meer on Project Bella and also received positive public comment in support of the project.
- ❖ Approved a resolution authorizing the City Manager to purchase one GO-4 EV Electric 3-Wheel Parking Enforcement Vehicle.
- ❖ Re-established the Historic Preservation Ordinance Ad Hoc Committee of 7 members.
- ❖ Held a first reading of an ordinance to permanently modify established parking time limits in the downtown area.
- ❖ Held a first reading of an ordinance regarding placement of vases and other objects at burial sites in El Carmelo Cemetery.
- ❖ Received a recommendation for future sidewalk improvements.
- ❖ Voted unanimously to take the necessary actions to secure additional funding currently being considered at both the state and county levels for City roads, bicycle lanes and pedestrian routes, but voted a split vote 4-3 split in authorizing a letter of support to be signed by Mayor Kampe.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Vegetation Fire on Highway 68. On August 28, 2015 at approximately 9:23 a.m., personnel from the Monterey Fire Department were dispatched to a vegetation fire on Highway 68 near Ragsdale Drive. The fire was on the eastbound shoulder of the Highway and was approximately 200' by 10' with a slow rate of speed. The fire was knocked down quickly without injury. Monterey Fire was assisted by personnel from CAL Fire and Monterey County Regional Fire District.



Surf Rescue. On August 30, 2015 at approximately 4:30 p.m., personnel from the Monterey Fire Department were dispatched to a coastal incident for an overturned vessel. A sailboat had capsized in the surf and both occupants were in the water holding onto the overturned boat. A State Parks rescue swimmer paddled out to the vessel while personnel in the fire boat made contact with the occupants. Both occupants were brought on board the fire boat for assessment. After it was determined that the occupants were not injured, they were returned to the Coast Guard pier. The overturned vessel was assisted back to the beach by State Parks and Fire personnel.



Community Emergency Response Team (CERT). On September 19, 26 and 27, 2015 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. CERT will hold classes for those who would like to be part of an emergency response team.

The CERT program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or

workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community.





