FIRE DEPARTMENT

CPR Incident. On October 5, 2016, at approximately 6:15 PM, Monterey Fire Department personnel responded to a report of a man down on the sidewalk with CPR in progress on Madison Street in Monterey. Monterey Fire personnel arrived on scene within 80 seconds of dispatch. Two citizens were already conducting hands-only CPR, one of whom was an off-duty Registered Nurse. Monterey Fire Personnel immediately took over CPR and applied an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). The patient regained a pulse and began breathing on his own. An ambulance arrived on scene and two fire personnel assisted with patient care while the patient was transferred to Community Hospital of the Monterey Peninsula (CHOMP).

Fire Hose Training. On October 10, 2016, Monterey Fire personnel conducted fire hose load and deployment training as well as fire flow calculations and equipment safety checks. These are some of the many areas of training that are conducted in between responding to calls, inspecting neighborhoods for fire hazards and conducting public education in fire safety.

The Monterey Fire Department utilizes the latest research regarding various aspects of firefighting techniques, including methods to load hose onto an engine, which allows for faster and more efficient hose deployment. One of the most important life-saving tactics performed at the scene of a fire is determining the appropriate stretch or hose distance from the engine to the point of entry and operating hose lines to extinguish the fire without them becoming entangled or restricted. Additionally, firefighters must be knowledgeable in calculating fire flow or the amount of water necessary for providing fire protection. They must also determine the adequacy of the water supply to specific types of construction or building types.

During the training, firefighters also performed hose inspection, which is important for keeping fire hose ready for emergencies. Success on the fire ground does not happen by chance; it happens through preparation.



Safety Fair and Open House. On October 22, 2016 from 11:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m., the Monterey Fireman's Association, Monterey Fire Local IAFF 3707 and Monterey Fire Department along with many participating partners, will hold the annual Safety Fair and Open House at the Fire Station located at 600 Pacific Street. There will be educational safety exhibits, auto extrication demonstrations, US Coast Guard Boat display, fire engine display, child safety seat inspection information, and other activities, as well as free hot dogs. 


MUSEUM
