CITY COUNCIL

Major actions taken by the Council at its regular meeting on October 19, 2016 include:

- ❖ Held second reading of an ordinance and adopted the 2016 Edition of the California Building Standards Codes and the amended 2015 International Property Maintenance Code.
- ❖ Held second reading and adopted an ordinance to amend the Salary Classification schedule.
- ❖ Received the Treasurer's Quarterly Report.
- ❖ Received the Quarterly Budget Report for the 1st Quarter Fiscal Year 2016-17.
- ❖ Received the Workers' Compensation Report for the 1st Quarter Fiscal Year 2016-17.
- ❖ Approved the drafted responses to the 2015-2016 Monterey County Civil Grand Jury Report.
- ❖ Discussed establishing a City Council Discretionary Fund to assist non-profit organizations in the City of Pacific Grove.

CITY CLERK

Voter Registration Deadline. The Monterey County Elections Office is reminding everyone that the deadline to register to vote is October 24, 2016 (this coming Monday!). For further details, please see the attached announcement.

COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Local Coastal Program Update. The Planning Commission will discuss a revised Local Coastal Program Land Use Plan and Implementation Plan at a Regular Meeting on **November 3, 2016** and if necessary, a second meeting on November 17, 2016. Once a recommendation is made by the Planning Commission, the Local Coastal Program will be brought before the City Council, anticipated to be scheduled in **January 2017** (note date change), for approval and subsequent submission to the Coastal Commission for anticipated certification.

A Special Meeting on October 27, 2016 will be held to discuss an ordinance to limit the size of lots and residential construction along Ocean View Blvd. To ensure Commission members receive correspondence with adequate time for review *please submit written communication by the previous day at 9:00 AM*. Planning Commission to Consider Downtown's "Historic Feel". On October 27th, the Planning Commission will be considering a proposed modification to the Zoning Ordinance for the downtown. The recommended modification would apply only to the downtown zoning

district. Mark Brodeur, Community & Economic Development Director, has stated that he believes the community likes the way Pacific Grove's downtown has a "historic feel", with buildings constructed right up to the back of the sidewalk, and side-by-side. He points out, however, that "as currently drafted, our Zoning Code regulation does not accurately reflect the urban layout of our historic downtown. Our code requires each parcel to provide 25% of the total lot to be landscaped." He added, "That is not part of our downtown's DNA – that's a suburban standard. A simple review of almost every existing building site in the downtown shows that 100% of the lot is covered with building, or in some cases, paving" he explained. "That means that every existing building and parking lot in the downtown is currently a legal non-conforming parcel" he concluded. If the Planning Commission endorses the proposed modification, new buildings in downtown would better reflect the existing pattern of development in the downtown. The change would alter the allowable site coverage from 75% to 100%. The Economic Development Commission considered the change at their October 13th meeting, and endorsed the idea.

FINANCE

Chavan & Associates, LLC. The City's independent auditors, Chavan & Associates, LLC, were in town this week performing the final work on the City's independent audit for the fiscal year that ended June 2016. You may recall that the group was in town 4 months ago doing preparatory work on the interim audit. This is the second audit that Chavan & Associates has undertaken for the City, having been awarded a [three-year agreement in April 2015](#). The final audit will be submitted to the Finance Director in November and Chavan & Associates will present their findings to Council at the December 7, 2016 Council Meeting. Sheldon Chavan and his team are highly valued partners in ensuring accuracy, accountability, and transparency of the City's financial resources.



OpenGov. The City will launch its financial transparency platform powered by OpenGov that makes it easy to explore how tax dollars are collected and spent. The site will go live on October 21, 2016. Everyone is welcome to attend a Community Workshop which will be held in the Council Chamber on October 25 from 5:30PM - 6:30PM. The workshop is intended

to help citizens learn about this fantastic new tool and how to navigate to the information they are interested in.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire Safety at MY Museum. On Friday, October 14, 2016, Monterey Fire Department personnel provided an hour of safety demonstrations, activities and a fire engine display at *MY Museum* to help educate local families with young children about fire safety during the fire prevention month of October.

There will be educational safety exhibits, auto extrication demonstrations, US Coast Guard Boat display, fire engine display, child safety seat inspection information, and other activities. Halloween Safety. Halloween is a fun and exciting time of year, but it is also an important time to practice fire and personal safety. Below is a list of tips to help keep everyone safe. Monterey Fireman's Charitable Association personnel will be handing out glow in the dark necklaces and candy at fire stations located at: 600 Pacific Street, Monterey; 582 Hawthorne, Monterey; 401 Dela Vina, Monterey; 600 Pine Street, Pacific Grove and Sixth Street between Mission & San Carlos, Carmel-by-the-Sea.

Safety Tips - Choose the right costume:

- Purchase costumes made of **flame resistant or retardant material** (Check the label). Fire resistant does not mean fire proof.
- Keep hemlines short enough to prevent tripping.

- Avoid loose and baggy sleeves. Stay away from billowing or long trailing fabric.
- Use make-up instead of masks which can obstruct vision.
- Use glow in the dark reflective tape on your costume.

Safety Tips - Decorations:

- **Never use candles** to light jack-o'-lanterns, use battery powered lights.
- Instruct children to stay away from open flames.
- Be extremely careful with cornstalks and other harvest season items. Keep them away from sources of heat.
- Keep exits clear of decorations so nothing blocks escape routes.

Safety Tips - Halloween night:

- Children should always go trick-or-treating with a responsible adult.
- If driving, be sure to watch for trick-or-treaters who are too busy to watch for you.
- Provide children with flashlights or glow sticks to carry for lighting and visibility.
- Do not allow children to carry sharp sticks or other objects that could cause injury to others.
- Keep your yard free of tripping hazards, such as garden tools, hoses, etc.
- Closely inspect all candy before allowing children to eat it. Discard any unwrapped treats from a stranger. **If in doubt, throw it out.**

LAW/POLICE DEPARTMENT

Weekly Highlights. Attached you will find Chief Christey's Weekly Police Report for the week of October 14, 2016 to October 20, 2016, with the Year-to-Date Monthly Highlights.

Evacuation Drill. On Thursday, October 20, the Monterey Bay Aquarium held a successful evacuation drill. Commander Rory Lakind participated in the drill as an observer. The drill includes the universal sign and color for evacuations. The sign says, "Evacuation Assembly Point" and features the symbol of arrows pointing inward toward a group of assembled people.



Body Worn Camera Pilot Project. The police department's Body Worn Camera pilot project received lots of attention from the local media this week. The City Manager made comments to the Monterey Herald, the Police Chief was interviewed by KION and KSBW, and the Mayor did an on-camera interview with KSBW.

During the City Council presentation regarding the Grand Jury investigation related to body worn cameras, the Police Chief explained the pilot project. The police department's body worn camera pilot project, funded by a PARSAC grant, has presented excellent opportunities and some of the challenges the department was working on to successfully implement the program.

The Police Chief informed the Council that Pacific Grove police officers have been wearing body cameras as part of the pilot program that started on July 30. Since that time, the department has recorded 254 hours of video and more than 2,000 videos.

The police chief told the Council that cameras will promote accountability and transparency, provide risk management benefits and valuable training resources, and that the use of cameras has proven to reduce the numbers of complaints and incidents of use of force.

She added that the cameras capture the "officer" perspective, improve training, collect and preserve evidence, enhance service delivery, document encounters with the public, and provide data for the prompt investigation and resolution of complaints and officer-related incidents.

In closing the Police Chief reiterated, implementing a body worn camera program will benefit the public because the use of the cameras will enhance collection of evidence and case prosecution. Cameras are evidenced to improve the high-quality public service expected of police officers, and the presence of BWC improves the performance of officers, as well as the conduct of individuals who are contacted.

To be eligible to register, you must be: (1) a United States Citizen; (2) a California resident; (3) at least 18 years of age on or before Election Day; and (4) not be in prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony.

Regular office hours are Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with extended office hours on October 24th 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.; Saturday, October 29th 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; and Saturday, November 5th 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
