



## PACIFIC GROVE WEEKLY SUMMARY

October 7, 2016

### CITY COUNCIL

Major actions taken by the Council at its regular meeting on October 5, 2015 include:

- ❖ Recognized both Don Mothershead and Faith Piraro for 35 and 25 years of service respectively, to the City of Pacific Grove.
- ❖ Held a second reading and adopted an ordinance to amend the PGMC Chapter 6.06, Section 6.06.055 to increase the City Manager's authority to act on claims against the City from under \$15,000 to under \$35,000, and to allow the City Manager authority to reject claims in any amount that are deemed not to be a proper charge against the City, and to modify Council Policy No. 000-7 accordingly.
- ❖ Held a second reading and adopted an ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget and establishing a special revenue fund and budget for the Coastal Conservancy Grant.
- ❖ Held a second reading and adopted an ordinance amending the fiscal year 2016-17 budget to: reallocate 1 full time equivalent (FTE) from Engineering Technician to Program Manager, increase .5 FTE Administrative Technician to 1 FTE and establish 4 FTE positions on loan.
- ❖ Received a report on Monterey County Elections Office estimate of costs to add a measure to a regular consolidated election.
- ❖ Authorized the City Manager to amend the agreement with Tope's Tree Service, Inc. to increase tree maintenance services by \$25,000 for the fiscal year.
- ❖ Introduced and held a first reading of an ordinance to adopt the 2016 Edition of the California Building Standards Codes and the 2015 International Property Maintenance Code, as amended, and directed a summary of a proposed ordinance be published as approved by the City Attorney.
- ❖ Introduced and held a first reading of an ordinance to amend the salary classification schedule to: (1) modify the salary ranges for Police Sergeant, Police Corporal, Police Officer, Police Reserve Officer I, Police Reserve Officer II, and Police Reserve Officer III; (2) approve the amendment; and (3) directed that a summary of a proposed ordinance be published as approved by the City Attorney.
- ❖ Approved submission of a letter to the Pebble Beach Company regarding proposed minor modifications to an inclusionary housing project.
- ❖ Approved the Pacific Grove Highway 68 Study Report and adopted the report's recommendations.

**Ballot Boxes.** The Monterey County Elections will drop off **two** ballot boxes for the General Presidential Election at City Hall. They will be located on the first floor of the building, near the Council Chambers.

## **FINANCE**

**Security.** The Finance Department is having a security barrier installed in the near future. Total Security Solutions Company will be installing a level 1 bullet resistant acrylic on the half walls that are perpendicular and parallel to the customer service counter and a full vision door to close off the customer service area to create a secure environment.

## **FIRE DEPARTMENT**

**Structure Fire.** On Thursday, September 29, 2016, at approximately 7:15AM, Monterey Fire personnel were alerted by way of a phone call that smoke was coming from a bungalow located at the Carmel Resort Inn on the west side of Carpenter Street in Carmel. Fire personnel arrived on scene to find smoke and flames coming from one of the units. Fire personnel were able to quickly get water on the fire and take control. Guests were evacuated from surrounding buildings, and no one was injured. The Deputy Fire Marshal arrived on scene to investigate the cause of the fire, which was determined to have been ignited by a combustible material next to a heat source. PG&E personnel were notified and arrived on scene to secure and evaluate utilities to the structure. *This incident could have had very different results, in that the initial call reporting the fire did not come through appropriate channels (the caller did not first call 911). Anyone suspecting a fire should immediately call 911 so that the Monterey County Communication Office can dispatch the proper resources to respond.*

**National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.** In support of National Breast Cancer Awareness Month, Monterey firefighters will be wearing pink shirts with the “go pink” logo beginning in early October through October 31, 2015. National Breast Cancer Awareness Month is a chance to raise awareness about the importance of the early detection of breast cancer. Everyone can make a difference by spreading the word about mammograms and encouraging communities, organizations, families, and individuals to get involved. Breast cancer is the second most common type of cancer in women. About one in eight women born today in the United States will get breast cancer at some point. The good news is that many women can survive breast cancer if it is found and treated early. A mammogram – the screening test for breast cancer – can help find breast cancer early when it’s easier to treat. **Unified Command Training.** On Thursday, September 29, 2016, Monterey Fire Boat and Coast Guard personnel participated in a Unified Command exercise lead by Harbor Patrol personnel. The exercise included a table top exercise which involved a mock scenario in which a small passenger shuttle departed from a Cruise ship that was docked in Monterey Bay. The simulated passenger shuttle was on fire, leaking fuel and was thought to have an explosive aboard which was heading toward the Wharf. The Unified Command worked together to determine appropriate steps and coordination of a successful outcome. A variety of training scenarios that could affect the Cities of Monterey, Carmel and Pacific Grove are crucial to being ready for a variety of circumstances, if they should occur.

## **HUMAN RESOURCES**

**New Hire.** The Community and Economic Development Department welcomes Quinton Roland to the team as Code Compliance Officer. Quinton comes to Pacific Grove from a property management firm in Ukiah after his family relocated to Pacific Grove this summer. Formerly,



Quinton worked for the City of Willits as a Water Conservation specialist and, as a consultant for the City of Marina where he helped to plan projects for community and economic development. Quinton has an MBA from Webster University in St. Louis Missouri. With basic training, and under the tutelage of CEDD staff, he will hit the ground running to move the Code Compliance Program forward. **Employee Service Awards.** Congratulations to Don Mothershead and Faith Piraro for their combined 60 years of service to the City of Pacific Grove!

**Don Motheshead** has been an employee of the City of Pacific Grove since 1981, serving all of these years in the recreation department. Don is a Coach, a teacher, a referee, an event coordinator and is able to constantly tie all of these items together to better the community through the City's recreation department.



Don manages the youth center and the preschool at the community center and when he walks in the door the kids swarm him to give “high fives” and hugs. He receives the same welcome when he goes to the Children's Pool at Lovers Point, a pool that he has managed for 30 years. In 2013 Don led a tremendous campaign that raised the funds to replace the aging pool. The City's Recreation Department, under Don's leadership, manages all of the City's authorized special events. He puts in countless hours with event organizers and City staff to ensure that the events all go on without any hiccups. Along with the special events, Don also single handily manages the City's recreational facilities, such as the parks, Chautauqua Hall, the Community Center, the Youth Center and the Little House at Jewell Park.

25 years ago, **Faith Piraro** left Lockheed Missiles and Space to join the City's Finance



Department. Faith is responsible for ensuring that City employees are paid correctly and on time, and enrolls employees in the City's benefit programs. She ensures the City's pension payments are made and she drafts and submits a number of State and Federal mandated reports on compensation and compliance with the Affordable Care Act.

The Finance Team celebrated Faith's 25 years at a luncheon earlier this week where her service was commemorated in the naming of a star in her honor. Because Faith undertakes such herculean tasks for the City, the star is located in the Hercules constellation and will,

from September 30, 2016 on, be known as “Faith Piraro's 25 PG Years”.

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Local Water Project Update.** The City is pleased to provide an update regarding the Local Water Project's pending final financial package from the State of California. The signed signature page that was executed by the City earlier this week has now arrived at the State Water Resource Control Board Division of Financial Assistance, and is simply awaiting signature from the designated State representative. Once the document is signed, and the City receives the final package with disbursement instructions, a Notice to Proceed with Construction will be issued to Perc Water, and the construction will commence. This is a great milestone for the City of Pacific Grove!

**George Washington Park.** The Public Works Department has been working to beautify George Washington Park. Our buildings and grounds team has completed the installation of the new backstop, and are in the process of replacing the playground equipment. In addition, the bathrooms have been repainted, and the BBQ area above the left field fence has been transformed. Older retaining walls and back fill material was removed and replaced, with the grounds then leveled to allow for new retaining blocks to be installed. Finally, the tables have been sanded as part of a complete overhaul. Go check out the park now – you'll see that the end result is great!

## ***For Immediate Release:***

Just after midnight on Monday, October 3, Pacific Grove Police Department investigated an armed robbery at the Otter Point turnout, located on Ocean View between Shell and Beach. Officers arrived within minutes of being dispatched; however, the suspects had already fled the crime scene. Pacific Grove Police Officers immediately notified local agencies and requested assistance with locating the suspects. Monterey Police Department officers responded to the call for assistance and contacted the suspects in the 2400 block of Fremont in the City of Monterey. Detectives from the Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team (PRVNT) and Salinas Police Department assisted with the investigation that resulted in the arrests of five suspects for armed robbery, and confirmed their involvement with two earlier robberies in Salinas on Sunday evening. Those arrested were, Rodrigo Rodriguez, 19, Salinas, Brian Romo-Campos, 23, Salinas, Daniel Avila, 20, Salinas, Augustin Castillo, 19, Salinas, and one 16 year-old juvenile who was booked at juvenile hall.

PG Police Chief Christey said, "I am proud of our officers for their quick response and immediate release of suspect information to our regional partners. Our regional partners, namely Monterey Police Department, PRVNT, Salinas Police Department and Monterey County Dispatch were swift with their response and I am grateful they captured the suspects responsible for the robbery in Pacific Grove."
