### CITY COUNCIL



**Election Results.** Unofficial, non-certified results from the Monterey County Elections Department for Tuesday's local election show Mayor Bill Kampe as being re-elected, and Cynthia Garfield, Robert Huitt and Nick Smith as the top vote-getters (respectively) in the race for the three open City Council seats. Again, these results are unofficial and non-certified at the time that this Weekly Summary document is published. The Monterey County Elections Department may require up to thirty (30) days from the date of the election to certify the results. The City of Pacific Grove is hopeful to have official, certified results prior to the December 7, 2016 City Council meeting to allow the new City Council to be seated. Congratulations and thank you from the entire City team to all Mayoral and City Council candidates who competed within the election this year for their commitment, concern and interest in leading the City forward.

## COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

**Local Coastal Program Update.** The Planning Commission discussed the fourth draft of the Local Coastal Program Land Use Plan and the third draft of the Implementation Plan at a Regular Meeting held on November 3, 2016. The item was continued to a second meeting on November 17, 2016. Once a recommendation is made by the Planning Commission, the Local Coastal Program will be brought before the City Council, anticipated to be scheduled in early 2017, for approval and subsequent submission to the Coastal Commission for anticipated certification. **Big Sur Half Marathon.** On November 13, 2016, Monterey Fire Department personnel will be front and center at the Big Sur Half Marathon by flying the American flag from a fire apparatus at beginning of race start line for the national anthem. **The race begins on Sunday at 6:30 AM on Del Monte Boulevard near El Estero Lake and backtracks to finish near Fisherman's Wharf** in Monterey. There are approximately 9,000 participants and a total of \$20,000 in prize money and bonuses. The Big Sur International Marathon is a non-profit organization that serves the community by providing a world class race and related events that raise money to benefit local charities, while promoting health and fitness. ## **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Holman Highway-Veterans Day Weekend.** Construction of the Holman Highway 68 Roundabout will require the full closure of the southbound Highway 1 off-ramp to Holman Highway 68 over the Veterans Day weekend. The ramp will be closed starting on Thursday, November 10th at 7 PM and will reopen on Monday, November 14th at 6 AM. **Holman Highway 68 and the other three ramps will be open during the southbound Highway 1 off-ramp closure.**

The temporary closure is required for crews to reconstruct the off-ramp so that the ramp will conform to the design of the future roundabout.

- Emergency vehicles will have full access at all times.
- The CHP will assist with the closure.
- Drivers going to Holman Highway 68 from southbound Highway 1 will be required to continue south and detour to Ocean Avenue.
- Motorists can expect delays of up to 20 minutes.

Also the half marathon will be running through Monterey and Pacific Grove on Sunday morning so the tunnel in Monterey will be closed. Detours will be in place and properly signed.

### Estimated Unprocessed Ballots for the November 8, 2016 General Election

**Salinas** — Monterey County Elections is in the official election canvass process. The canvass is a 28 day period required by law to conduct a full accounting and tabulation of all ballots cast in the election. The ballots cast include provisional ballots and vote-by-mail ballots delivered on Election Day or received within the three days after the election with a postmark on Election Day.

In processing vote-by-mail ballots, elections officials must confirm each voter's registration status, verify each voter's signature on the vote-by-mail envelope, and ensure each person did not vote elsewhere in the same election before the ballot can be counted. Other ballots that are processed after Election Day include provisional ballots (processed similar to vote-by-mail ballots), and ballots that are damaged or cannot be machine-read and must be remade by elections officials.

State law requires county elections officials to report their final results to the Secretary of State for presidential electors by December 6, 2016, and for all other contests by December 9, 2016. The Secretary of State will certify the results for presidential electors to the Governor by December 10, 2016, and will certify the results of all state contests by December 16, 2016.

As of Thursday, November 10, the estimated number of ballots to be processed is over 59,800. The next reports will be posted by close of business day on Wednesday, Nov. 16 and Friday Nov. 18, 2016.

### Estimado de boletas por procesar de la Elección General del 8 de noviembre

**Salinas** — El departamento de Elecciones del Condado de Monterey está en el proceso de escrutinio oficial. Este proceso es un periodo de 28 días requeridos por ley para llevar a cabo una contabilidad completa y el conteo de todos los votos emitidos en la elección. Las boletas emitidas incluyen las boletas provisionales y las boletas de voto-por-correo recibidas el día de elecciones o dentro del plazo de tres días laborales después de la elección con un matasellos al día de la elección.

En el proceso de boletas por correo, los oficiales electorales deben de confirmar el estado de registro de cada votante, verificar la firma de cada votante en el sobre de la boleta por correo y asegurarse que cada uno de ellos no haya votado en otro lugar previo al conteo de su boleta. Otras boletas que son procesadas después del día de la elección incluyen las boletas provisionales (procesadas de igual manera que las boletas por correo), y las boletas que están maltratadas o que la máquina no pudo leer los votos y deben de ser reproducidas por los oficiales electorales.

La ley estatal requiere que los oficiales electorales de los condados reporten los resultados finales a la Secretaria del Estado para los electores presidenciales al 6 de diciembre del 2016 y para las otras contiendas al 9 de diciembre del 2016. La Secretaria del Estado certificará los resultados de los electores presidenciales ante el Gobernador al 10 de diciembre del 2016 y certificará todas las contiendas estatales al 16 de diciembre del 2016.

Al jueves 10 de noviembre, el número estimado de boletas electorales a procesar es más de 59,800. El próximo informe de resultados electorales será publicado al cierre de negocios el miércoles, 16 de noviembre y el viernes 18 de noviembre del 2016.





## STREET ACCESS AND PARKING FOR THE HALF MARATHON AND RELATED EVENTS Saturday, November 12 and Sunday, November 13

### SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 12 – 3K & 5K

#### Parking Restrictions:

- **No parking** from 4 a.m. to 10 a.m. along the waterfront on Ocean View Blvd. between 17<sup>th</sup> (Lovers Point area) and the ocean end of Lighthouse Avenue at the Pacific Grove Golf Links.

#### Street Access:

- During the course of the event, from approximately 6 a.m.-10 a.m. the road will be closed in both traffic directions on the waterfront on Ocean View Blvd. and Sunset Drive from Lovers Point to Pt. Pinos. **Residents who live along Ocean View that may need to exit during the race should pre-park a vehicle on a nearby side street for egress.**
- Residents along Mermaid Street and guests of Borg's Motel and Lovers Point Inn may exit and enter on Mermaid Street at Sea Palm. Vehicles will be allowed to drive against the stated direction in order to exit the area.

### SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 13 – Half Marathon

#### Parking Restrictions:

- **No parking on the entire portion of the waterfront from 4 a.m. to 10 a.m.** This includes both sides of the street on Ocean View Blvd. and Sunset Drive from Eardley Avenue to Asilomar.
- **No parking** on the westbound side of Lighthouse Ave. between Fountain and Congress; on either side of the street on Fountain Avenue between Ocean View and Lighthouse; on 17<sup>th</sup> Street from Ocean View to Central; and on Central Ave. from Congress to 17<sup>th</sup> Street from 4 a.m. to 9 a.m.

#### Street Access:

- During the course of the event, from approximately 6 a.m.-10 a.m., the road will be closed in both traffic directions on the waterfront on Ocean View Blvd. and Sunset Drive from Eardley to Sunset Drive near the Fishwife. **Residents who live along Ocean View that may need to exit during the race should pre-park a vehicle on a nearby side street for egress.**
- Residents along Mermaid Street and guests of Borg's Motel and Lovers Point Inn may exit and enter (cautiously) on Mermaid Street at Sea Palm only. Vehicles will be allowed to drive against the stated direction in order to exit the area.
- Between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:45 a.m., residents and visitors between Fountain and 16<sup>th</sup> from Ocean View to Lighthouse Avenue, will be allowed to exit the area in one location only. The exit area is located at the intersection of Central Avenue and Fountain Avenue (by the Library). Please note: there will likely be delays in exiting this area due to the number of runners crossing at the peak time. **NOTE: 17<sup>th</sup> St. residents will have only pedestrian access from their homes between these hours.**
- Between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., residents on 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and Caledonia Streets between Jewell and Central Avenues will need to exit via Union or Jewell and leave the area on Pacific Ave. Residents on one-way streets will be allowed to drive against the stated direction in order to exit the area.

### SUNSET DRIVE AND ASILOMAR AREA RESIDENTS' INFORMATION

During the course of the event, from approximately 6:00 a.m.-10 a.m. on Sunday, November 13th, traffic flow on Sunset Drive below Asilomar Blvd will be restricted to vehicles wishing to visit the Beachcomber Inn and Asilomar Conference Grounds. A Pacific Grove Police Department officer will be assigned to the intersection of Sunset and Asilomar Blvd to assure access is maintained to the motel and conference grounds. **Residents who live on Sunset Drive between Asilomar Blvd. and Lighthouse needing to leave during the race should pre-park a vehicle on a nearby side street (Lighthouse, Jewell Avenue, Arena or Pico).**

### Reminder: Veterans Day Weekend Ramp Closure for Holman Highway 68 Roundabout Construction Starts Tonight

MONTEREY COUNTY – Construction of the Holman Highway 68 Roundabout will require **the full closure of the southbound Highway 1 off-ramp to Holman Highway 68 over the Veterans Day weekend. The ramp will be closed starting on Thursday, November 10 at 7 p.m. and reopen on Monday, November 14 at 6 a.m.**

- Emergency vehicles will have full access at all times.
- The CHP will assist with the closure.
- Drivers going to Holman Highway 68 from southbound Highway 1 will be required to continue south and detour to Ocean Avenue.
- **Motorists can expect delays of up to 20 minutes.**

The temporary closure is required for crews to reconstruct the off-ramp so that the ramp will conform to the design of the future roundabout.


