



PACIFIC GROVE WEEKLY SUMMARY

February 19, 2016

CITY COUNCIL

Major actions taken by the Council at its regular meeting on February 17, 2016 include:

- ❖ Held second reading and adopted an ordinance establishing speed limits on specific streets for enforcement by the use of radar or other electronic devices.
- ❖ Held second reading and adopted an ordinance amending Municipal Code Chapter 15.16.045 – Sidewalk Seating and Sidewalk Dining.
- ❖ Approved recommended use of previously collected donations from the Library Stewardship Committee account and City of Pacific Grove Funds 07 and 31 for capital improvements scoped out within the Library Renewal Project.
- ❖ Authorized the Interim City Manager to award a purchase order with Cypress Coast Ford for the purchase of one 2016 Ford Explorer Interceptor, to be assigned to the Chief of Police, in the amount of \$33,639
- ❖ Received minutes from the following Boards, Commissions and Committees: Business Improvement District, Golf Links Advisory, Historic Preservation Ordinance Adhoc and Planning.
- ❖ Received the 2016-21 Five-Year Fiscal Forecast, the Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget Schedule, an updated Fiscal Analysis and Diagnostic, and provided direction.
- ❖ Approved a resolution authorizing the Interim City Manager to enter into an agreement with Fall Creek Engineering, Inc. to prepare the updated Pacific Grove ASBS Compliance Plan, in an amount not to exceed \$80,915, approve an agreement with the City of Monterey for the reimbursement of \$30,915 toward the Plan, and authorize the Interim City Manager to make minor improvements to the agreement as issues arise.
- ❖ Received a report regarding utility bill assistance and provided feedback.
- ❖ Authorized the Interim City Manager to enter into a reimbursement agreement with Domaine Hospitalities, LLC proponents for Project Bella to cover costs of the preparation and management of an Environmental Impact Report, and additional costs associated with the acceleration of City's Local Coastal Program.
- ❖ Received an update from CalPERS Subcommittee.
- ❖ Received a report regarding Pension Finances from Councilmember Peake.

Five Year ForecastThe City Council. received [the Five Year Forecast and the FY 2016-17 Budget Schedule](#) at the February 17 meeting. The forecast assumes no new revenue sources, with a continuation of existing trends and the continuation of existing levels of service. The summary table below shows a positive net result of operations is forecasted for FY 2016-17 of \$103,000.

While the modest surplus projected in the next fiscal year is encouraging, the Council also received information regarding a summary of deferred capital projects and reduced service levels that are the primary reasons for the addition to the General Fund balance for the past seven years. The Council will hear further recommendations for the FY 2016-17 budget at its meeting on March 16, 2016.

The morning after the Council meeting, City Staff delivered the same presentation to members of the business community at the Pacific Grove Chamber of Commerce event “Good Morning Pacific Grove” held at the museum.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Regional Training Exercise – On February 16, 17 and 19, 2016, the Monterey Fire Department hosted a regional training exercise with personnel from Cal Fire and the Seaside Fire Department at the Holman building in Pacific Grove. The training consisted of incident management, hose line deployment, self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) use, engine, truck and ladder placement, rescuing victims, and breaching walls/doors. The ability to utilize the Holman building provided an invaluable and unusual comprehensive training opportunity. This allowed local fire agencies to work together in a training environment to better prepare for a real event and ensure that we are better equipped to handle emergency situations for a safer community. The smoke seen in the photo below was created with the use of smoke machines and provided a realistic environment for improving efficiency and concentrating on fighting fires and rescues.

ROADS

Emergency Guardrail and Pavement Repair on U.S. Highway 1 and 68 in Monterey County Monday and Tuesday. A two-day emergency guardrail and pavement repair maintenance project at two locations on U.S. Highways 1 and 68 in Monterey County will take place on Monday, Feb. 22 and Tuesday, Feb. 23, Caltrans officials have announced. Details are as follows:

Monday, Feb. 22, guardrail repair in Carmel Highlands from 9 am to 1 pm:

- Southbound Hwy. 1 at Fern Cyn. /Corona Rd.
- One-way reversing traffic control with flaggers
- 10-minute delays anticipated

Tuesday, Feb. 23, pavement repair near Pebble Beach from 10 am to 2 pm:

- Eastbound and westbound Hwy. 68 at Scenic Overcrossing
- One-way reversing traffic control with flaggers
- Up to 20-minute delays anticipated, motorists are advised to take alternate route

NOTE: There will be Electronic Message Boards alerting motorists of closures.

The purpose of this project is to provide motorists and bicyclists a safer route to travel. Both the guardrail and pavement damage are due to the recent rains, needing urgent repair. Roadwork is expected to be complete by Tuesday, Feb. 23, weather permitting.

This roadwork is being performed by Monterey Maintenance and Monterey Guardrail crews.

Caltrans reminds motorists to move over and slow down when driving through highway work zones.


