PUBLIC WORKS

Storm Drain and Sewer Project. This week the City Council approved Public Works to begin a large Storm Drain and Sewer Project that will be replacing approximately 6,700 linear feet of storm drain, replacement of 33 storm drain manholes and 43 storm drain catch basins from Pine Avenue west of Forest to the Lovers Point Outfall. The Project will be replacing old storm drain lines along Pine Avenue, down Park Street, along Short Street, through Caledonia Park and will pick up the storm drains on Jewell Avenue, along with a few storm drains on the cross streets that flow into this main line. The project will also consist of the replacement of 3,460 linear feet of sewer main lines within Mermaid Avenue, Ocean View, Marine and Clyte, tying into the existing line at Sea Palm. The City will be performing Public Outreach on this project to all properties that will be affected by the project. It is anticipated that the project will start after the raining season and continue into late fall of 2016. 


