COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Local Coastal Program Update. The Local Coastal Program Land Use Plan May 2016 will be posted shortly on the [Local Coastal Program](#) website. The Implementation Plan revisions are still in progress and will be posted when available.

An informational report regarding outstanding issues will be before [Council](#) on May 18, 2016 and the [Planning Commission](#) will discuss the issues and provide direction on May 19, 2016.

Land Use Plan policy issues that are under discussion with Coastal Commission staff include:

- Sea level rise and associated hazard policies concerning erosion and flooding;
- The definition of existing development;
- Stormwater runoff and water quality;
- Fencing and subdivision in the Asilomar Dunes neighborhood;
- Ability to implement a parking program in appropriate areas to fund coastal access and coastal restoration projects.

Implementation Plan issues for Planning Commission direction include:

- Commercial-Visitor Zoning District Height Limits;
- American Tin Cannery Zoning Floor Area Ratio;
- Density Standards for Visitor-Serving Parcels.

Given the comments received, the timeline adopted by Council in January 2016 has been extended and revised.

PARSAC. As of July 1st, the City will transition Workers' Compensation Administration services from York Risk Services to PARSAC (Public Agency Risk Sharing Authority of CA) and their Workers' Compensation services partner, LWP Claims Solutions. This change will allow the City to take advantage of PARSAC's pooled resources and expertise. Our goal is to provide the best assistance to injured employees and minimize lost work time and costs to the City.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Search and Rescue Partners Meeting – On May 23, 2016, the Monterey Fire Department will participate in a quarterly meeting of Search and Rescue (SAR) Partners to include personnel from the U.S. Coast Guard Station Monterey, California Highway Patrol (Air Operations), City of Santa Cruz Fire Department (Marine Safety Division), and California State Park Lifeguards.

The goal of the meeting is to share agency information regarding asset capabilities, and discuss procedures. The agencies work together to provide the best outcome during an event needing a variety of resources such as fire engines, boats, helicopters, and rescue divers.

HUMAN RESOURCES

Ergonomics. Human Resources conducted several ergonomic desk evaluations for the police department this week with more evaluations to continue in the following weeks for the department. Training. Several city supervisors and managers attend the Liebert Cassidy Whitmore, Maximizing Supervisory Skills for the First Line Supervisor training offered this week. The program was designed to help both new and experienced first-line supervisors be effective, successful and productive workforce managers. The workshop featured realistic and practical discussions of the challenges faced by supervisors. In addition, skills critical to successful management were covered including effective leadership, goal setting, communication, delegation, preparing performance evaluations, and discipline. Attendees interacted and shared experiences, problems and expertise with one another which made the training highly interactive.

Recruitment. The Chief of Police recruitment closed on April 29th with 54 interested applicants applying. Those applications were reviewed and assessed with the top 7 applicants moving forward in the recruitment process and being invited to a panel interview in the later part of May.

PUBLIC WORKS

Solar Lights. The Public Works Department has installed two more solar lights in the Candy Cane lane neighborhoods. The first one was installed at the intersection of Beaumont and 14th Street, and the second was installed at the Beaumont and McFarland. To date the City has installed 10 Solar Lights in the neighborhood and 3 wired lights in Platt Park.

Railings at Lovers Point. Public Works has also completed the railing on the Pier at Lovers Point this week and is now preparing the stairway on the pier for new railings. The railings had been fabricated in the mechanical shop at Public Works and then powder coated to be able to withstand the harsh elements of the seawater and air. The mechanical staff did a fantastic job building the railings.






