



## PACIFIC GROVE WEEKLY SUMMARY

June 17, 2016

### CITY COUNCIL

Major actions taken by the Council at its regular meeting on Month #, 2015 include:

- ❖ Adopted a resolution calling the general municipal election for Mayor and City Councilmembers, consolidating the municipal election with the statewide election on November 8, 2016, and authorizing the Monterey County Election Department to provide services.
- ❖ Approved a resolution authorizing the City Manager to extend until June 30, 2018 the existing contract with William J. Silva, Professional Engineer, to provide professional traffic engineering services, in an amount not-to-exceed \$50,000 per fiscal year.
- ❖ Approved a resolution authorizing the City Manager to amend the Professional Services Agreement with Knight Communications to provide technology support services, extending the agreement date through December 31, 2016 in an amount not-to-exceed \$58,000.
- ❖ Received the second quarterly report on the progress of the Local Water Project.
- ❖ Approved the Carmel Film Festival's request to hold their Filmmakers Beach Dinner at Lovers Point Park on Saturday, October 22, 2016, with special exemption of Muni Code §§s 11.04.020, 11.04.030 and 14.08.010.
- ❖ Approved the request by the Chamber of Commerce for the Pacific Grove Back in Time Car Show special event on Lighthouse Avenue on Saturday, July 9, 2016, between the hours of 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM, with the understanding that full cost recovery will be expected.
- ❖ Authorized the City Manager to enter into a master reimbursement agreement with Holman Building Associates.
- ❖ Held second reading and adopted an ordinance approving the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-17 Operating and Capital Improvement Budget.
- ❖ Council heard the appeal of the Planning Commission for the netting at the golf course and upheld the Commission's decision, conditioned on the installation of a 14-foot netting. Council found the height adequate to satisfy concerns with safety and preservation of open space.
- ❖ Approved a resolution appointing Mayor Bill Kampe and Councilmember Bill Peake as Director and Alternate Director to the Monterey Peninsula Regional Water Authority, terms starting July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2018.
- ❖ Discussed the implementation of a proposed admissions tax ordinance and provided direction to staff related to a proposed ballot measure for the November 2016 General Election. The Council will take action at their July 20, 2016 meeting.
- ❖ Received a report on Business License Tax Ordinance Revision and provide direction to staff related to a proposed ballot measure for the November 2016 General Election. The Council will take action at their July 20, 2016 meeting.

## **CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE/PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT/PG&E**

**LED Streetlights.** Following a presentation from Joe Foster of PG&E at Wednesday's City Council meeting, three (3) pilot LED streetlight installations will take place at the following locations in Pacific Grove:

- 515 Junipero Avenue (across from the Community Center),
- 77 Asilomar (across the street from the Point Pinos Grill, and by the 10th tee), and
- 1065 Congress (in front of the drop off for Forest Grove Elementary).

Installation of replacement LED streetlights at these three locations will take place in the next day or so. In taking this approach, it will allow the community the opportunity to view these installed LED streetlights in a very limited deployment to better understand how they differ from the existing incandescent sodium streetlights found throughout most of the City on the PG&E-owned fixtures.

In order to allow for this demonstration period (rather than immediately assuming a City-wide deployment of LED streetlights on the PG&E-owned fixtures), the City will forgo its "next-in-line" place in the deployment schedule for PG&E's service territory. PG&E will allow the City the opportunity to evaluate the LED streetlights for at least a month, gathering feedback from the community. During this time period, and assuming there is no overwhelming negative feedback, PG&E will review and recalibrate its LED streetlight deployment schedule within its service territory, and determine when it may return to Pacific Grove to commence a comprehensive deployment of LED streetlights on PG&E-owned fixtures.

As stated during Wednesday night's presentation, LED streetlights are significantly more energy efficient than the incandescent sodium streetlights that they are proposed to replace, and have a considerably longer lifespan. It is hoped that the community will be able to "see" first-hand the benefits that these LED streetlights may bring to Pacific Grove through this pilot installation. Following installation of the LED streetlights at these three locations, feedback may be provided to the City's Public Works Department by calling 831.648.5722.

## **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

**Local Coastal Program Update.** On June 16 the [Planning Commission](#) partially discussed the proposed changes to the Land Use Plan that were recommended at the June 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Planning Commission meetings and listed in Attachment 1 of the [June 16 Agenda packet](#). The Planning Commission voted to continue the Item to a Special Meeting on July 7, 2016 at 4pm.

As a result of the Planning Commission continuation to July 7, the Local Coastal Program will not be brought before Council on June 29. No new Council date for the Local Coastal Program is scheduled at this time.

On June 21, 2016, the [Beautification and Natural Resources Committee](#) will receive an update on the definition of "major vegetation" in the coastal zone and corresponding Coastal Development Permit requirements.





## **FIRE DEPARTMENT**

**Airplane Crash.** On June 9, 2016 at approximately 8:00 PM, Monterey Fire personnel responded to a distress call from the pilot of a Cessna 182 aircraft that had a possible landing gear malfunction. Fire personnel staged on the tarmac for the landing. As the airplane approached all landing gear systems appeared normal and the pilot was able to bring down the retractable landing gear. However, after landing, the front landing gear failed causing the airplane to fall forward onto the nose of the aircraft. Fire personnel provided the tower with an update while responding to the airplane. Upon arrival, all three passengers had already exited the plane on their own accord and were uninjured. Fire personnel assisted in gathering information and coordinating the removal of the airplane with the Monterey Airport Operations staff.

**Human Resources.** The HR Manager finished meeting individually with each of the City's Department Heads this week to discuss HR support with the departments. The meetings proved to be informative and helpful in prioritizing human resources needs of the municipal organization.

**Labor Relations.** The Police Officer's Association and City management met this week and negotiations are moving in a positive direction. More meetings are scheduled in June and July to continue the dialogue and finalize terms and conditions for union membership consideration. Human Resources also participated in an informational meeting with the General Employees Association this week, and was present to assist in answering benefit questions.

Additionally, the Community Economic Development Department is recruiting for a Code Compliance Officer. 
