### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

**Local Coastal Program Update.** On June 1 and 2, the [Planning Commission](#) completed its review of the Land Use Plan portion of the Local Coastal Plan (LCP). The Planning Commission now turns its attention to the task of reviewing the Implementing Plan, or zoning portion of the LCP, which will take place at the regularly scheduled Planning Commission meeting of June 16. Implementation Plan issues for Planning Commission direction include:

- Commercial-Visitor Zoning District Height Limits;
- American Tin Cannery Zoning Floor Area Ratio;
- Density Standards for Visitor-Serving Parcels.

**PLN130447 Public Hearing. [Pebble Beach Company Inclusionary Housing Project](#)** The County of Monterey has cancelled the May 25, 2016 hearing date, and instead will hold a public hearing to consider the project on **June 8, 2016** at 9:00 AM in the Monterey County Board of Supervisors Chambers, County Government Center, located at 168 West Alisal Street in Salinas, CA. The project consists of: 1) a Use Permit and Design Approval to allow the construction of 24 affordable housing units; 2) a Use Permit to allow the removal of approximately 725 trees and associated grading. The [Final Environmental Impact Report](#) identified significant unavoidable impacts to traffic and water supply. ## **FIRE DEPARTMENT**

**Public Safety Appreciation Night** – On June 1, 2016, two Monterey Fire Department personnel were honored at a dinner sponsored by the Monterey Elks Lodge’s first Annual Public Safety Appreciation Night which also included recognition of several police officers.

Captain Roger Reed and Engineer Raul Pantoja (pictured with Fire Chief Gaudenz Panholzer) were nominated for their significant contributions to the betterment of our community because of their involvement in the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program and public education programs.

Captain Reed helped establish the precursor to the CERT program and continues to serve as the Fire Department’s liaison for the CERT program. This program educates members about disaster preparedness and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety and light search and rescue. CERT members then assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. Additionally, Captain Reed serves on several Fire Department committees and was instrumental in the establishment and the on-going support of the department’s *Critical Incident Stress* program. He has received several awards within and outside the organization for his contributions and continues to mentor others.

Engineer Pantoja continues to lead and was the force behind the “movie-in-the-park” program co-sponsored by the Fire Department and Monterey Fire Fighter Association (MFFA) the past two summers. The program requires tremendous coordination and his vision to create a fun event for families in a community setting while learning about fire safety has been hugely successful.

In his short three years with the Department Raul has volunteered at numerous fire department events and organized the First Annual 4<sup>th</sup> of July Pancake Breakfast, a fundraiser in which all proceeds went to *My Museum*. Engineer Pantoja continues finding opportunities for public education and community outreach, and last year invited a family with three children into his family’s home when they were displaced and lost their belongings in a fire. He is a true example of caring and compassion for those in our community.

## **HUMAN RESOURCES**

**Recruitment.** The top Chief of Police candidates met with the City Manager this week. Each candidate brings with them previous Chief of Police experience, as well as strong management and community policing skills. The City Manager will be conducting additional review of the top candidates, including in-person visits with key stakeholders within the communities where the top candidates currently work. When considering this effort, as well as the need for an extensive background check for the selected finalist, it is likely that the new Pacific Grove Chief of Police will start sometime in late July. Interim Chief Belcher has advised the City that he is willing and able to continue to serve in the Interim Chief capacity until that timeframe, and will make sure his time overlaps with the start of the new permanent Chief to ensure a smooth, seamless transition for the community, the department and the municipal organization.

**New Hires.** The City welcomes new and returning seasonal employees working in the Recreation Department to staff the Adventure Day Camp and the Stillwell Children's Pool at Lover's Point. Twelve new hires completed new hire orientation and training which included CPR, First Aid and Basic Life Support.

**Training.** Next week City leadership staff are invited and encouraged to attend two half-day supervisory trainings offered by Liebert Cassidy & Whitmore (a labor relations consortium to which the City belongs).



Dear Neighbor,

The twenty-second annual Triathlon at Pacific Grove will be held Saturday, June 11, 2016 and Sunday, June 12, 2016.. This exciting event has proven to be very popular with participants, spectators, the Pacific Grove residents and businesses. The Olympic Distance Triathlon will be held on Saturday from 7:30 am and end at 3:00 pm. On Sunday the 5 & 10K runs will start on Ocean View Blvd at 7:30 am, followed by the Sprint Distance Triathlon at 8:40 am and end at noon.

We invite you to come out on one or both days and become part of the excitement. You can cheer from your front yard or you can come to Lovers Point, but please come. Be a spectator, a volunteer or a maybe even a participant.

As with any event of this magnitude, it is critical that all persons who could potentially be impacted by its implementation be notified in advance to minimize any problems stemming from the activity. The attached fact sheet summarizes street access and parking restrictions associated with the triathlon. You are encouraged to contact the organizers of the event, Tri-California, at 373-0678 if you have any questions or need additional information. On race day you can contact Race Director Terry Davis on his cell phone at 809-8444.

Once again the Triathlon will be centered at Lovers Point in Pacific Grove. The swim event will be held in the ocean at Lovers Point beach. After the swim, participants will bicycle from Lovers Point Park on Ocean View Boulevard along Sunset Drive to Asilomar Avenue, just below the Fishwife Restaurant and return via the same route to Lovers Point. After completing the bike course, triathletes will begin the run portion of the event. The Triathlon run course will go from Lovers Point on the recreation trail to near the Monterey Bay Aquarium. The runners will turn around before reaching the **① Aquarium (at Eardley Avenue)** and return to Lovers Point via Ocean View Boulevard. On Saturday the Olympic runners will run up Twelfth Street, head south one block to Central Avenue, then west one block to Thirteenth Street, and return north to Ocean View Boulevard to Lovers Point. On Sunday, the Sprint Distance Triathlon run course will go from Lovers Point to just east of Berwick Park. The runners will turn around and return via Ocean View Boulevard.

The City recognizes that the Triathlon may inconvenience some residents who live along the course. In this regard, we are committed to minimize problems and make the event an exciting and enjoyable experience for everyone. This is the pledge of the City, the Triathlon Committee of Directors, and the 500 volunteers who help on race day. We have included a map of the course for you to see.

**In conjunction with the city of Pacific Grove and the Police Dept, we will not be issuing resident/permit passes. Any and all streets with No Parking signs apply to everyone – no resident exceptions. Please park your vehicle on a nearby side street to allow you access to leave during race road closures if you need to leave your home.**

## STREET ACCESS AND PARKING FOR THE TRIATHLON

### PARKING

1. No parking on the entire portion of the waterfront on Saturday, June 11, from 12:01am - 4pm and on Sunday, June 12 from 12:01am - 1pm. This includes both sides of the street on Ocean View Boulevard and Sunset Drive from Forest Avenue to Crocker Avenue. On Saturday, June 11 from 12:01am- 4pm on the south side of Ocean View Blvd. from 17<sup>th</sup> Street to Eardley Ave. On Sunday, June 12, from 12:01am to 1pm on the south side of Ocean View Blvd from 7<sup>th</sup> Street to 17<sup>th</sup> Street.
2. No parking on Ocean View Blvd between Forest and 17<sup>th</sup> Street from 8am Friday, June 10 to 6pm Sunday, June 12. *★ Detour sign - Sending traffic up Grand*
3. No parking in the parking lot at Ocean View Boulevard and 17th St., from noon Wednesday, June 8th until 6pm on Sunday, June 12th.
4. No parking on the south side (park side) of Ocean View Boulevard and 17<sup>th</sup> Street in the immediate area of Lovers Point from 9pm, Friday, June 10, until 3pm on Sunday, June 12. On the north side, no parking from 9pm on Friday, June 10 until 3pm on Saturday, June 11, and on Saturday from 9pm until 1pm on Sunday June 12.
5. No parking On Central Avenue from Carmel Avenue to 14<sup>th</sup> Street on Saturday, June 11, from 4am to 4pm. This includes both sides of the street. This street is open on Sunday.
6. No parking on both sides of 12<sup>th</sup> Street and 13<sup>th</sup> Street on Saturday, June 11, from 4am to 4pm. As required by the city of Pacific Grove and the Police Dept, we will not be issuing resident/permit passes. Any and all streets with no parking signs apply to everyone – no resident exceptions.

### STREET ACCESS

1. During the course of the event, from approximately 6:30am-3:00pm on Saturday June 11, the road will be closed in both traffic directions on the waterfront (Ocean View Boulevard and Sunset Drive) from Forest Avenue at Ocean View Boulevard to Crocker Avenue at Sunset Drive near the Fishwife. Approximately 1,000 cyclists (amateurs) will be staged in intervals, on to this course, between the hours of 7:15-12:00pm. Approximately 30 cyclists (professionals) will be on this course from 12:30-2:30pm. On Sunday, June 12, the above roads will be closed from 6:30am-11:00am
2. During the course of the event, traffic flow on Ocean View Boulevard on Saturday, June 11 from approximately 6:30am-3pm, from Forest Avenue, east to the city limit at Eardley Avenue, and on Sunday, June 12, from approximately 6:30am-11:00am from Forest Avenue to 7<sup>th</sup> Street, will be CLOSED.
3. During the course of the event, from approximately 7:30am to 3pm on Saturday, June 11, 12<sup>th</sup> Street and 13<sup>th</sup> Street from Ocean View to Central Avenue will be closed. Residents living along the course that need to leave their home during the race hours park on side streets near their homes, to allow them access to leave Pacific Grove during the hours that roads are closed.

### MOTEL AND MERMAID RESIDENTS INFORMATION


4. During the course of the event, from approximately 6:00am-3pm on Saturday, June 11 traffic flow on 17th Street from Ocean View to Mermaid Avenue will be restricted to vehicles wishing to visit the Lovers Point Inn, Borg's Inn or residents of Mermaid Avenue. A Pacific Grove Police Department officer will be assigned to the intersection of Ocean View Boulevard, Jewell Avenue, and 17<sup>th</sup> Street to assure access is maintained to the motels and Mermaid Avenue. Mermaid residents may also access Mermaid via Sea Palm.
5. During the course of the event, from approximately 6:00am-3pm on Saturday, June 11, traffic flow on Sunset Drive will be restricted to vehicles wishing to visit the Beachcomber Inn. A Pacific Grove Police Department officer will be assigned to the intersection of Sunset and Crocker to assure access is maintained to the motel.


