PUBLIC WORKS

Continuous Deflection System. The City will be installing, as part of the 14th and Sinex Storm Drain and Sanitary Sewer system upgrades, a CDS unit on Central Avenue above Greenwood Park. A CDS unit is a Continuous Deflection System that acts like a large washing machine and removes all trash and debris from the storm drain line prior to any storm water entering the ocean. The City currently has 4 CDS units in place and this will be our 5th unit. Construction will start next week on Central Avenue, between 12th and 13th street. Central will be closed between these streets and traffic will be diverted. Please see attached notification.

George Washington Park. Public Works has received a grant from Cal Fire to perform maintenance in George Washington Park, for fire suppression and general cleanup. The grant consist of the City receiving a work release crew to perform work such as the removal of downed or low hanging limbs, the removal of dead brush and the knocking down of tall dry grass. This work will start by the ball field portion of the park moving north.

Crosswalk Painting. Public Works has been painting the crosswalks around the schools this week in preparation to the beginning of the school year. This is an activity that Public Works performs every year, but it usually goes unnoticed as crews come in at night to complete the painting. Most of the yellow sidewalks located around schools are on our major roadways and to paint the cross walks during the days would require significant traffic control and would cause delays. By the crews perform this work at night lanes can easily be shut down and the work can occur with little to no vehicle traffic. It is anticipated that all the yellow crosswalks will be repainted by the end of next week.

New Directional Signs. Public Works, in conjunction with the Chamber of Commerce, have installed new directional signs along Central Avenue. The new signs simply read "Downtown", with arrows to guide our visitors to our beautiful downtown area. Many visitors come into town via Central Avenue and don't even know that they are in Pacific Grove, let alone know that we have a historic downtown. These signs are intended to guide and inform our visitors.

The Planning Commission continued discussion of the Local Coastal Program at a Special Meeting on July 7, 2016 that began at 4PM. FIRE DEPARTMENT

Water Rescue. On July 9, 2016, at approximately 5:00 p.m., Monterey Fire Department Fire Boat personnel were at the Coast Guard pier securing the Fire Boat, when a Fire Captain witnessed a yellow tandem kayak with two subjects aboard approximately 50 to 100 feet from the Coast Guard Pier screaming for help. A Coastal Incident Response was instituted while the Fire Boat launched and drove toward the kayakers. The two kayakers were successfully brought aboard the Fire Boat along with their paddles and kayak. Both kayakers appeared safe and denied any medical issues. They were transported the back to the fuel dock and left with Adventures by the Sea personnel at the Coast Guard Pier shop.

Recruitment. Several recruitments are in process as we transition our online application system from CalOpps to NeoGov. NeoGov is used by over 1,500 public sector agencies and offers more automation to the recruitment process as well as electronically stores recruitment materials. With NeoGov applicants can submit job interest cards for future City vacancies, electronically store their employment application, self-schedule written exams, assessments and interviews. Implementation of NeoGov will take place over the next several weeks. Meanwhile, Code Compliance Officer, Police Officer Lateral, Police Officer Recruit, Police Services Technician and Library Clerk are at various stages of the recruitment process. Any new recruitments will be opened in NeoGov system.


the administrative divisions of The World's countries (provinces, counties and such). In the resources section one can find a long list of national statistical agencies.

Award Selection Criteria

Nominations may be based on one or any combination of the following selection categories:

1. **Overall Work Performance:** Significant in quality or quantity enough to distinguish the employee from fellow staff members.
 - (a) **Quantity:** Extra effort demonstrated by responding capably and positively to a special project, additional assignment, personnel shortage, etc.
 - (b) **Quality:** Demonstrated by superior skill in execution of duties or application of outstanding job knowledge. Work product or service is superior in every detail.
 - (c) **Achievement:** Significant individual effort or contribution led to the achievement of department goals and objectives.
2. **Leadership/Interpersonal Skills:** Demonstrated exemplary behavior toward other City employees and the public, shared knowledge and skills with others, provided positive and helpful feedback and guidance through suggestions and training opportunities.
3. **Public Relations:** Individual efforts that generated lasting or significant positive public relations for the City as demonstrated through citizen feedback and compliments by way of telephone, letter, news articles, etc. May also be demonstrated by employee's exceptional judgment, communication skills, and strong rapport in dealing with the public under adverse or pressure situations.
4. **Cost Saving or Safety Suggestions:** Provided suggestions or proposals that were implemented and resulted in a significant cost savings for the City through staff efficiency, effectiveness, equipment or materials purchase or usage. Provided and/or implemented suggestions or proposals that significantly reduced the potential for employee or citizen injury or a lawsuit through the elimination of a safety hazard or risk exposure.
5. **Team Work:** Made a significant contribution to the success of a coordinated project within a City department, between several City departments, or between the City and other government or local community groups.
6. **Emergency Response:** Demonstrated outstanding individual effort that minimized or solved a serious work related situation. May be demonstrated by a meritorious act in saving the life of another employee or citizen through administering first aid or rescuing a person in a life threatening situation.

Award Nominations

Nominations for quarterly awards must be received in the City Manager's Office by the close of the last day of the month prior to the award date (December 31st, March 31st, June 30th, and September 30th) to be eligible for consideration during that quarter. Any nominations submitted following the deadline will be considered during the following quarter.


