August 19, 2016

CITY COUNCIL

Major actions taken by the Council at its regular meeting on August 17, 2016 include:

- ❖ Acknowledged Community and Economic Development Department employee Haroon Noori as Employee of the Quarter.
- ❖ Acknowledged twenty-year employees Jeffrey Fenton and Paul Hughes, and five-year employee Merrill Olinger, for their service to the City of Pacific Grove.
- ❖ Adopted a resolution amending Council policies related to investments and City credit card use.
- ❖ Amended Municipal Code Chapter 11.96 to enact construction noise time limits.
- ❖ Discussed gull abatement, and directed staff to return at a future City Council meeting with additional details, options and considerations for a proposed 2017 gull abatement program.
- ❖ Authorized the City Manager to enter into an agreement with TrailPeople for the design, environmental review and permitting of the Point Pinos Trail project for a cost not to exceed \$197,697 plus a 10% contingency.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Local Coastal Program. The Planning Commission canceled its regularly scheduled meetings of August 4 and 18, 2016, and will continue discussions of the Local Coastal Program Land Use Plan and Implementation at a Special Meeting on **August 25, 2016 at 6:00 PM**. Please note that in order to allow Planning Commissioners adequate time for review, **written communication should be submitted to the City by the day prior to the Planning Commission meeting by 9:00 AM.**

Once the Planning Commission finishes discussing proposed changes to the Land Use Plan and Implementation Plan, revised documents will be brought before the Planning Commission once more for final review and recommendation to the City Council, which is likely to occur in October. Following City Council review and approval, subsequent submittal to the Coastal Commission for anticipated certification will then occur.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Wildland Fires. Monterey Fire personnel were released from the Soberanes fire on August 15, 2016. The wildfire, which began as an illegal campfire, broke out on July 22 and has burned over 79,000 acres and is now at 60% containment. There are currently nine significant wildfires burning within California.

Monterey Fire Crews moved from the Soberanes fire are now deployed at other wildland fires around the state, including:

- Clayton fire in Lake County (burned 3,929 acres and is at 55% containment)
- Chimney fire in San Luis Obispo County (burned 8,300 acres and is at 30% containment)
- BlueCut fire located in San Bernardino County (burned 31,689 acres and is at 4% containment)


Jeff is seen as a mentor by the department, and looks forward to opportunities in be able to assist fellow employees in their careers.

PUBLIC WORKS

At this week's Beatification and Natural Resource Commission meeting, Public Works presented the recommended maintenance activities that will be performed in the Monarch Sanctuary this year. All activities need to occur prior to the Overwintering of the Butterflies, which commences on October 1st. The Public Works Department will be hosting our annual walk through of the Sanctuary on September 1, 2016 at 10:00AM. This walk through will highlight this year's maintenance activities.

This year's maintenance recommendations for the Monarch Sanctuary include:

- Removing the remaining Pines that have significant decline due to Pitch Canker
- Redwood Management
- Replanting Understory Pines
- Acacia Management
- Planting Live Oaks
- Thinning Cypress to prevent overcrowding
- Removing dead Pines near the hotel driveway
- Reviewing Blue Gums in the southeast sanctuary corner, (formally potted) for weak root systems
- Repairing irrigation system

Holman Highway 68 Roundabout Construction Update. Construction of the Holman Highway 68 Roundabout will require night-time road construction from 8:00 PM to 6:00 AM. on the nights of Wednesday August 24 and Thursday August 25.

- The construction work will result in traffic control and flagging through the intersection of Holman Highway 68 and the southbound Highway 1 on and off ramps.
- Emergency vehicles will have full access through the work zone at all times.
- Motorists should expect delays of approximately 10 - 15 minutes.

Additionally, the project will enter a phase with increased night work starting Sunday, August 28th, continuing through the week of September 12. However, no work will be undertaken during Labor Day Weekend. A press release with all the important information will be released next week.

Award Selection Criteria

Nominations may be based on one or any combination of the following selection categories:

1. **Overall Work Performance:** Significant in quality or quantity enough to distinguish the employee from fellow staff members.
 - (a) **Quantity:** Extra effort demonstrated by responding capably and positively to a special project, additional assignment, personnel shortage, etc.
 - (b) **Quality:** Demonstrated by superior skill in execution of duties or application of outstanding job knowledge. Work product or service is superior in every detail.
 - (c) **Achievement:** Significant individual effort or contribution led to the achievement of department goals and objectives.
2. **Leadership/Interpersonal Skills:** Demonstrated exemplary behavior toward other City employees and the public, shared knowledge and skills with others, provided positive and helpful feedback and guidance through suggestions and training opportunities.
3. **Public Relations:** Individual efforts that generated lasting or significant positive public relations for the City as demonstrated through citizen feedback and compliments by way of telephone, letter, news articles, etc. May also be demonstrated by employee's exceptional judgment, communication skills, and strong rapport in dealing with the public under adverse or pressure situations.
4. **Cost Saving or Safety Suggestions:** Provided suggestions or proposals that were implemented and resulted in a significant cost savings for the City through staff efficiency, effectiveness, equipment or materials purchase or usage. Provided and/or implemented suggestions or proposals that significantly reduced the potential for employee or citizen injury or a lawsuit through the elimination of a safety hazard or risk exposure.
5. **Team Work:** Made a significant contribution to the success of a coordinated project within a City department, between several City departments, or between the City and other government or local community groups.
6. **Emergency Response:** Demonstrated outstanding individual effort that minimized or solved a serious work related situation. May be demonstrated by a meritorious act in saving the life of another employee or citizen through administering first aid or rescuing a person in a life threatening situation.

Award Nominations

Nominations for quarterly awards must be received in the City Manager's Office by the close of the last day of the month prior to the award date (December 31st, March 31st, June 30th, and September 30th) to be eligible for consideration during that quarter. Any nominations submitted following the deadline will be considered during the following quarter.


