



PACIFIC GROVE WEEKLY SUMMARY

September 23, 2016

CITY COUNCIL

Major actions taken by the Council at its regular meeting on September 21, 2016 include:

- ❖ Held second reading and adopted an ordinance to amend the City of Pacific Grove's Conflict of Interest Code.
- ❖ Received a report regarding the Highway 68 Corridor Study.
- ❖ Received a report regarding the June 30, 2015 CalPERS Valuation Reports.
- ❖ Authorized the City Manager to execute a contract with Hinderliter, de Llamas & Associates (HdL) for sales/use tax auditing services administration, for a term of up to three years and for a total contract amount of \$114,900, not to exceed \$38,300 per year.
- ❖ Determined Pacific Grove's position on resolution to be considered at the League of California Cities' Annual Conference, and directed that in the absence of alternate direction, the Pacific Grove representative will vote in support of the resolution as recommended by the League.
- ❖ Released funds remaining in the City's account to the Monterey Homeless Challenge fund.
- ❖ Held a public hearing and introduced the first reading of an ordinance to amend Pacific Grove Municipal Code (PGMC) Chapter 6.06, Section 6.06.055 to increase the City Manager's authority to act on claims against the City from under \$15,000 to under \$35,000 and to allow the City Manager authority to reject claims in any amount that are deemed not to be a proper charge against the City, and to modify Council Policy No. 000-7 accordingly.
- ❖ Introduced and held a first reading of an ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget and establishing a special revenue fund and budget for the Coastal Conservancy Grant.
- ❖ Introduce and hold first reading of an Ordinance Amending the Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget to reallocate 1 full time equivalent (FTE) Engineering Technician to 1FTE Program Manager, increase .5 FTE Administrative Technician to 1 FTE, established 4 FTE position on loan, and directed a summary be published as approved by the City Attorney.
- ❖ Received the Local Water Project Quarterly Report.
- ❖ Received a status update report regarding the Domaine Hospitality Reimbursement Agreement.
- ❖ Approved a resolution approving the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Pacific Grove and the Police Officers Association to cover the period of January 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018.
- ❖ Received an informational item regarding valve replacement and upgrading at the MRWPCA's Pump Station Number 13 in Pacific Grove.

Friendly Election Season Reminder. Considering that we are in the midst of the election season, the City Manager and City Clerk would like candidates, employees, and the community in general to draw their attention to Pacific Grove's Charter, which states the following regarding political activities, City Council candidates, and City employees:

Article 43 Political Activities

- (a) No candidate for elective or appointive office in the City shall solicit any assessment, subscription, contribution or political service for any political purpose from anyone on the employment lists of the City.
- (b) One who holds or seeks election or appointment to any public office in the City shall not directly or indirectly use or promise or threaten to use authority or influence to secure any vote, political influence or action or contribution from any officer or employee of the City.
- (c) No officer or employee of the City shall advertise the fact of his or her employment by the City in any public advertisement for a political candidate or ballot issue.
- (d) Nothing herein contained applies to funds, contributions and services solicited or received to promote or defeat any ballot measure which would affect the rate of pay, hours of work, retirement, civil service or other working conditions of said officers and employees, provided such activity does not occur during working hours or in places of public duty.

COASTAL CLEAN UP DAY September 17 Report Out. A big thank you to all the volunteers that came out last Saturday! Save Our Shores and the [Monterey Regional Stormwater Management Program](#) hosted a site at Lovers Point Beach in the City's [Area of Special Biological Significance](#). Overall, a total 3,300 volunteers came out at over 75 sites. In three hours, volunteers picked up **10.2 TONS** of garbage that was kept out of the ocean. The number one culprit was cigarette litter. Cigarettes are the number one item found worldwide as litter on beaches. Cigarettes have 43 toxic chemicals that kill marine wildlife and shore birds. Even if you weren't able to participate last Saturday, Save Our Shores holds monthly cleanups. Local Coastal Program Update. The Planning Commission will discuss a revised Local Coastal Program Land Use Plan and Implementation Plan at a Regular Meeting on **November 3, 2016** and if necessary, a second meeting on November 17, 2016 (please note these date changes). Once a recommendation is made by the Planning Commission, the Local Coastal Program will be brought before the City Council, anticipated to be scheduled on December 7, 2016, for approval and subsequent submission to the Coastal Commission for anticipated certification.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Monterey Fire Receives SAFER Grant - On September 20, 2016, the Monterey City Council approved hiring for five new positions and the award of a Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant, which funds three of those positions through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The grant and approval of the positions will bring the department back up to staffing levels that had been reduced over three years prior. Additionally, the positions will decrease the cost of overtime by bringing the up level of available staffing, saving the City money and providing better service to the residents (not only the City of Monterey, but those Cities that contract for fire suppression services with the Monterey Fire Department, including the City of Pacific Grove. Labor Relations. The City Council approved a multi-year agreement with the Pacific Grove's Police Officer's Association (POA) at their meeting on Wednesday night. The City Council voted unanimously to approve a contract with the POA that provides for a phasing in of a health care benefits, modest cost of living adjustments, and additional employee pickup of PERS retirement contributions. The contract term runs through June, 30 2018. Both the City and the POA believe that the new labor agreement will be beneficial to both recruitment and retention efforts within the Police Department.


Drive Safely. The Police Department reminds our community to drive safely in Pacific Grove. Last night, officers investigated a non-injury traffic collision at the intersection of Sunset Blvd and Congress Ave. Officers also conducted proactive traffic enforcement at the intersection of 17



Mile Drive and Sunset Blvd, due to reports of drivers failing to stop at the controlled intersection. PGPD wants everyone to enjoy a safe weekend and reminds you to please obey posted traffic signs when driving in PG.

Gun & Drug Destruction. On Tuesday of this week, the Police Department made a trip to a landfill facility to incinerate years of accumulated guns and drugs from the Property and Evidence Room. In total, 900 pounds of guns and weapons (including knives, brass knuckles, even nunchucks and a sword!) were melted down into gobs of unrecognizable metal. And, 180 pounds of both illicit drugs (meth, heroin, marijuana, and more) and prescription medications. This has been a huge task in ensuring each item was appropriately inventoried and accounted for, as well as reviewing each case to ensure each item was approved for destruction. A huge shout out to PST Michaela Basanese for working so diligently in getting this

PUBLIC WORKS

Central Avenue Storm Water Equipment Project. The City of Pacific Grove has completed the installation of a Continuous Deflective Separation (CDS) unit on Central Avenue that is tied into one of the City's largest storm drain systems. A CDS unit screens, separates and traps debris that flows through the storm drain system prior to the outfall above Green Wood Park. This system was installed as part of the 14th and Sinex Storm Drain and Sanitary Sewer Project that is nearing completion.

The Installation of the CDS unit enveloped the entire block of Central, between 12th and 13th Street. The CDS unit is approximately 12 feet wide and 26 feet deep and the diversion structure is roughly 10 feet in height and 16 feet in length. This massive equipment took more than a month to install, but the benefits greatly outweigh the disruption to Central Avenue. Now that the road has been repaved and is open for traffic, no one will not even know that these systems are in place. In addition to this unit on Central, the City has two at Lovers Point, one at Green Wood Park and two on Ocean View between Dewey and Eardley. Twice a year the City uses our Vactor Truck, which is literally a vacuum on wheels, to clean the units.

The work had previously been scheduled to be done from 10AM to 11 but was re-scheduled.

The Holman Highway 68 Roundabout Project will relieve congestion at the intersection of Highway 68/Highway 1, and will improve access to the Community Hospital, Pacific Grove, Monterey and Pebble Beach. The project is a partnership between the City of Monterey, the City of Pacific Grove, Pebble Beach Company, the Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District, the County of Monterey, Caltrans, and the Transportation Agency for Monterey County (TAMC).
