




Capital Campaign Timeline


- Outreach to potential donors underway

- Public campaign to run through Labor Day





































Timeframe for the Project

- On Feb. 15th Public Works Director Gho instructed our Architect, Karin Payson, to begin Design Development. Based on Karin's original project schedule this would mean reaching the 50% Construction Documents (CDs) milestone and preliminary cost estimates, by early July.
- The original project schedule allowed 8 weeks more to deliver 100% CDs and a tighter cost estimate. This would be around Labor Day... which fits well in terms of the end of the Capital Campaign.
- If permitting goes smoothly and bidding goes well, it is conceivable that the City could be reviewing bids and negotiate and award a contract before Thanksgiving.
