Commissioner Kim attended the TAMC Bike and Pedestrian Committee meeting on March 6, 2019:
Ariana Green from TAMC presented updates on the TAMC Bike Secure program and the Measure X Safe Routes to School program that they're continuing to implement in Seaside and Marina, with an eye on rolling out programming in all of Monterey County eventually. TAMC received a \$2.1M, three year grant from the state for non-infrastructure Safe Routes to School programming and will launch a website around bike month. They're partnering with MyMuseum to develop a traveling miniature town to demonstrate street safety to kids, starting at the Steinbeck

Center May through July, and looking for other kid-friendly and secure, static locations to rotate the exhibit to around the county. They're also continuing to work with Monterey County and Ecology Action to have a series of bike, traffic, and walking safety education and traffic gardens in Pajaro and King City. The goal is to create sustainable and reproduce-able Safe Routes to School programming.
